1. Book Budgets

The allocations for the 2011/12 book budgets have now been finalized. The totals are the same as last year, with a few small increases in growing subject areas. Please continue to send all book suggestions and reading lists to your Subject Librarian.

2. Opening hours

The Science Library is now open until 22.30 on Fridays (extended from 19.00). Additionally we aim to extend the 24-hour opening period by a week, and to address a long-term issue for postgraduate students by opening at weekends over the summer vacation.

3. Science Library – moves and refurbishments

The Science Library has seen a number of moves and refurbishments over the summer.

- Computer Science books and journals have moved to the 4th floor with the other Engineering materials.
- Physics books have moved to the old Computer Science location in the Physical Sciences Reading Room on the 3rd floor.
- The old Physics room has been converted into two new group study rooms, which are bookable in the same way as the popular group study pods on the ground floor.
- New desks and chairs have been installed in several reading rooms including all the rooms on the third floor.
- All desks in the Science Library now have a power point to enable readers to charge their laptops.

5. Induction and Training

The team is available to offer training on finding information resources, referencing, plagiarism, databases and other related topics.
