1. Budgets

Book budgets have re-opened for the new academic year. There has been an approximate 3.5% cut to the book budgets to meet budget requirements.

2. Reading lists

We added all year 1 reading lists for MAPs departments for the beginning of this academic year. Looking at individual course statistics these are regularly being used by the students for accessing material. During the course of this year we would like all Moodle courses to be updated with the reading list link, academics to take over ownership of the lists, as well as moving onto the Year 2 lists.

3. Opening Hours

Please note an important and welcome change to our opening hours over the Christmas break to come. UCL traditionally closes down for the best part of two weeks over Christmas and new year. 6. Open Access

The Government's endorsement of the Finch Report, and the new RCUK (Research Councils UK) policy on Open Access to its funded research outputs will have a significant affect on the future of scholarly publishing, with a new emphasis on Gold Open Access publishing. The Vice-Provost (Research)'s Office is modelling the impact of these policy developments, supported by the Director of Library Services. Guidance will be issued to academic Departments, Faculties and Schools on how to proceed in this new external policy environment.
